In PHSCE this term, we will be focusing on Relationships and Health Education. Children will be learning about 'body knowledge and awareness', 'personal hygiene', 'illness prevention' and much more. Gardening Club



We are so lucky at Mercenfeld Primary School as we have our very own garden, vegetable patch and greenhouse.

With the help of children from across the school our on-site garden is looked after.

The children learn how to look after the plants and the equipment whilst developing cooperation and other social skills.





The children talk excitedly about clearing areas of ground by pulling up old weeds; using and caring for tools such as long stalk forks and spades. The children also find out about creatures that they find during their gardening activities – they have even found a frog!

Most excitingly of all the children are able to sample some of the home-grown produce and have described the peas as the 'most delicious and fresh things 'they had ever eaten!

EYFS – Koalas

Puddles and Rainbows


This mini project teaches children about the weather that happens during spring and allows them to explore natural phenomena, including rainbows. It supports them to explore colour in the natural world.

Dangerous Dinosaurs

This exciting project teaches children about the different animals that roamed Earth millions of years ago and how they are related to animals that live on Earth today.

Literacy -Writing simple phrases and sentences, reading comprehension, correct formation of letters


Maths - Number problems, cardinality 1 -15, one more and one less (fewer), comparison, patterns, positional language and shape

Yr 1 - Toucans

This term we look at **School Days** – comparing life as a school child today with life as a school child in Victorian times. The children will revisit geographical skills from our last unit and use these to explore the local area of Markfield then and now.

We will flex our creative muscles again when we learn about how artists such as James Rizzi have represented Street Views, as well as designing and making our own sandwiches in Design Technology!

In computing, we will find out about methods for Data Handling which may come in useful when we put on our science hats to find out all about Plant Parts and Animal Parts.

Our English topics will see us writing stories about familiar settings and finding out about how to write a letter. This is the term when we really get to show off how good we are at phonics because we will be taking part in the Phonics Screening test too.

Learning how to measure time and money, apply arrays, multiply and share numbers and begin to know about fractions will be a few of the topics we cover in Maths.



Yr 2 Meerkats and Zebras

We are having great fun with our new topic 'Magnificent Monarchs'. We are finding out about the English and British monarchy from AD 871 to the present day. Using timelines, information about royal palaces, portraits and other historical sources, we are building up an understanding of the monarchs. Towards the end of the summer term we will research several of the most significant sovereigns. We hope to arrange a fun dress up day and really get into the role of a magnificent monarch later in the term.

We are using our knowledge from our history sessions to help us write letters and diary entries in literacy. We continue to work on our grammar, punctuation and spellings.

In maths we have been working on time. We have covered o'clock, half past, quarter to and quarter past times. We have looked at telling the time in 5 minute intervals and have solved time problems. We will move onto learning about capacity, mass and weight.

During our art lessons we will learn about portraiture. We will analyse the portraits of Tudor monarchs and compare Tudor portraits and selfies today.

In design technology we will learn about sewing patterns. We will use a running stitch and embellishments.

In science we will recap our knowledge about animal survival, habitats and microhabitats. We will also take part in a range of experiments.

Our work in RE is focusing on 'celebrations' then we will move onto 'places of worship.'

We are super busy and we are really enjoying our learning.



Yr 3/4 – Penguins, Rhinos and Chameleons

Ancient Civilisations

Maths:

In Maths we will be learning how to tell the time to one minute and solve time related problems. We will also be applying addition, subtraction, multiplication and division to solve money problems.

English:

English lessons will be linked as far as possible to our Ancient Civilisation topic. We will find out about the features of Ancient Sumarian Hymns and have go at writing our own. We will also explore stories from other cultures, reading extracts from a range of books and also write our own, which will give children the opportunity to apply grammar and punctuation skills.

Wider Curriculum:

This topic will give children the opportunity to explore the Ancient Egyptians in detail through a range of curriculum areas including: D/T, Art, PE, History and Geography.

Within music the Year 4's will be lucky enough to be learning how to play some brass instruments, whilst the Year 3's will be exploring some exciting samba music.

Our RE focus this half-term is on food and fasting. The children will learn about why food is important to different religions and the sacrifices that some religions make with regards to food.

In PE pupils will have the opportunity to participate in gymnastics as well as enjoying cricket and rounders, hopefully in the sunshine.

This half-term's computing lessons will focus on extending children's knowledge and ability to use Scratch for coding.

During our PHSCE lessons we will be exploring relationships and aspects of the human body, thinking about human life cycles.

French lessons will be based around shopping; including food and money.

Year 5 – Huskies and Orcas

During the summer term our Topic is Sow, Grow and Farm which links nicely with our science of Life Cycles and our geography topic Enough for Everyone. This will give us plenty of opportunity to get outside and explore nature.

In Maths we are learning about shape and measures and revisiting areas we have covered this year.

In English we are reading and thinking about characters in Coraline. After half term we will be looking at the short film Alchemist's Letter.

Earlier this term, we went on a walk in our local area for a Geography day where the children practiced their map reading skills. All of the children were a credit to the school and themselves.

Year 5 have enjoyed swimming lessons over the past 8 weeks and all the children have improved.

We would like to say a huge well done to all the children for an amazing music concert and a big thank you to all the parents who came. We are very proud of what they achieved over such a short space of time with Mr G.



Year 6 – Panthers and Tigers

This summer term, we have been really proud of how hard the children have been working as they have just completed their SATs. During these assessments, the children applied themselves really well and were super focused.

This term, our main topic is Britain at War and we will be looking closely at both World War I and World War II. The children seem to have been really engaged in this topic so far and are keen to gain more knowledge on the subject.

Auditions for our end of year production have taken place this week and the children well and truly showed off their talents! Over the coming weeks, the children will be working hard on this and our performance will take place during the last week of term. More information and dates will follow shortly.

In PE, the children have been doing athletics, which is perfect timing, as sports day and the annual Saffron Lane competition will be taking place in June.
