#### Commando Joe




## **Year 2 Healthy Eating**


## Healthy snacks and drinks

A reminder that in EYFS and KS1 children can access free milk though the Cool Milk scheme. However, after they turn 5 parents do have to register to ensure their child still gets milk. All children in EYFS and KS1 also get a free piece of fruit every day.
