

#### 5 top tips on keeping your child safe online.

#### 1. Talk openly with your child about online safety.

- As your child is starts to access the internet, talk to them about what they are reading, watching and who they are communicating with online.
- Make sure these conversations continue as they grow older.
- Ask them to write down a list of apps they use/ want to use and look at them together. Talk about what is appropriate and remind them that this is different for every family.
- There will come a time when your child will access the internet outside the safety of home and you want to prepare them for that.
- Talk about being a digital citizen and their online reputation (how they behave, interact and represent themselves) and know who your child's online friends are.

#### 2. Keep screens and devices where you can see them and keep track of online time.

- Try your best to monitor you child's time online (in particular younger children)
- Keep the devices in a central spot where it is easy for you to keep an eye on.
- Maybe try and have an agreement where there are no tablets, laptops or gaming devices in the bedroom.
- It is recommended that children should have no more than 2 hours of screen time a day.
- Try and set timers and set a non-negotiable finish time.

#### 3. Know about parental controls (https://www.internetmatters.org/parental-controls/)

- Innocent searches can lead to not so innocent results.
- Parental controls and search restrictions can help with this.
- For example SafeSearch filters can block sites with inappropriate material. Although not 100% accurate, it can help prevent your child from seeing things you don't want them to see.
- The link above allows you to search the different controls for smartphones and devices, apps, networks social media, gaming consoles and search engines.

#### 4. Be social network savvy

- Look at the apps your child uses and want to use and sign up to them. This allows you to find out how to use the privacy settings and reporting mechanisms.
- By signing up to them allows you to give the best advice to your child.
- Talk to your child about how to stay safe online.
  - o Talking to a trusted person when they are worried.
  - o Being aware of online bullying, both as a perpetrator and a victim.
- Make sure your child knows how to
  - Report inappropriate/ offensive posts
  - Block someone
  - Keep information private

#### 5. Lead by example

- Always model the kind of positive behaviours you would like your child to use.
- If you limit your screen time, only use devices in designated spots, be open about talking about online then your child is more likely to follow in your footstep.

Ultimately, we don't want to instil fear or prevent children from experiencing technology and being online. There are tons of benefits from being online and with technology ever growing and they will inevitable go online. However, we want to give them the skills and knowledge they need to make the most of it and avoid the dangers that it poses.

Congratulations to Isla Lockwood in Year 4 (Turtles) who won the prize for naming the four houses that are now in place. Well done Isla!






